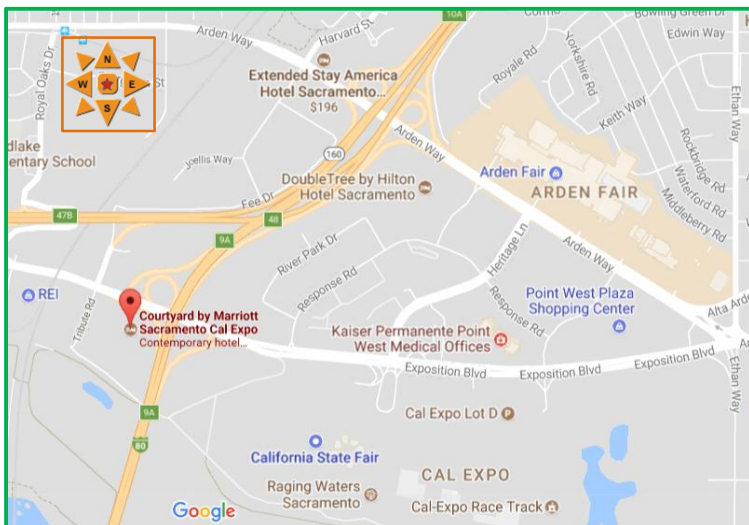
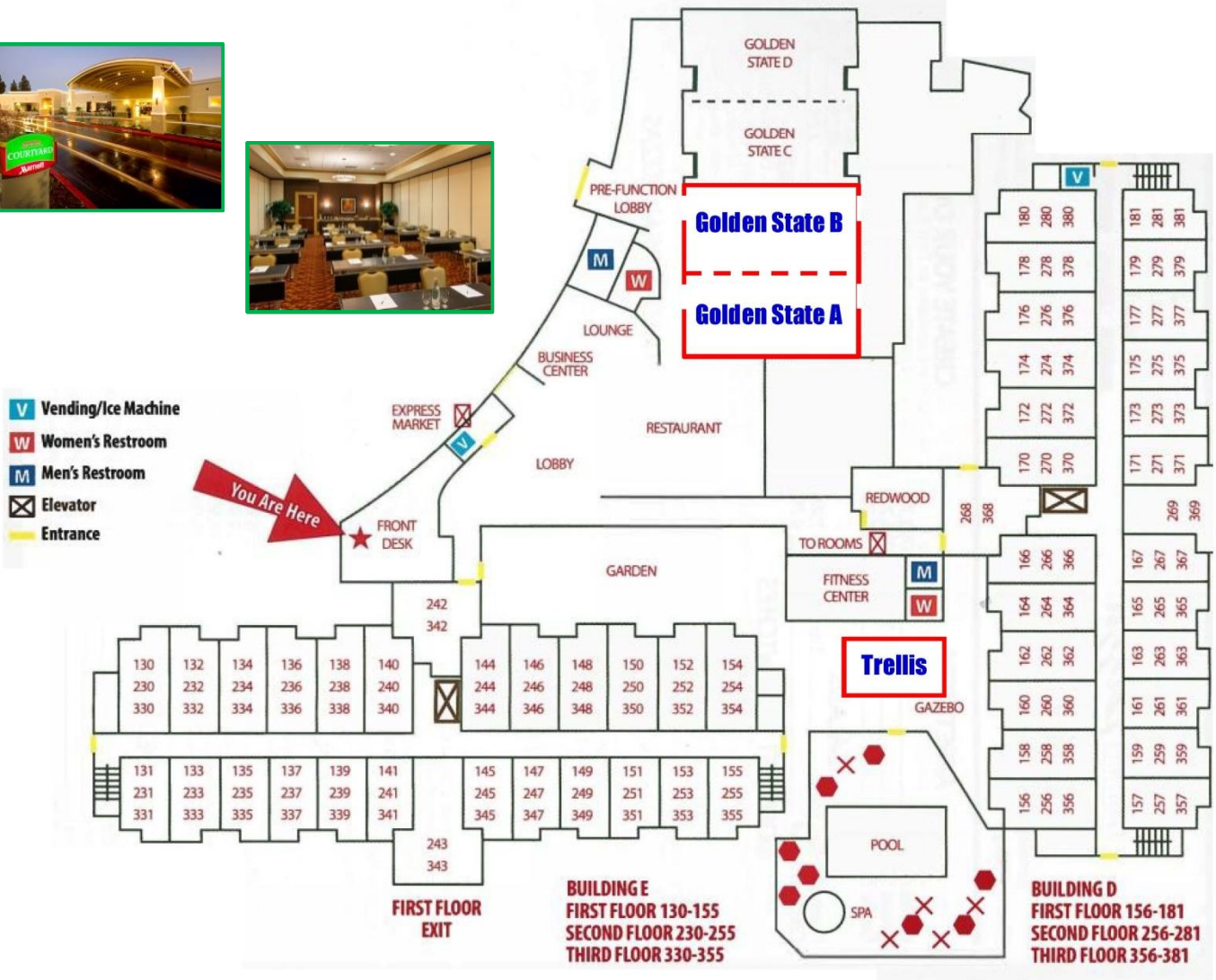

The Safety Committee/EC wanted to remind the Board about our growing safety video library that is available to all members and that a working safety and drug & alcohol testing programs pays dividends and not just for workers' comp, but for reducing PL/PD claims too.

I. WSTA's Endorsed Insurance Program Partners, EPIC Insurance

- **Trump Signs EO on 10-12-17 to Expanded Association Health Plans**

Association health plans are a means for small businesses to pool together to purchase insurance, thereby securing greater purchasing power and cheaper premiums. For example, independent farming businesses will often join together in farm bureaus, and purchase insurance through those collective entities.

Before Obamacare, associations were free to model their national plans around the regulatory requirements of any individual state. Which is to say: A farm association with members in Alabama and New York could provide the latter with skimpy plans that would otherwise be barred by the Empire State's benefit requirements. This appealed to small businesses with younger, healthier workforces, which used association plans to avoid subsidizing more comprehensive coverage for small business with older, sicker employees.

The Affordable Care Act put an end to this state of affairs, by subjecting association health plans to the same essential health-benefit requirements as individual small businesses.

Trump's executive order calls on the secretary of Labor to expand the use of association health plans by making it easier for associations to form across state lines, and to band together for the exclusive purpose of purchasing health insurance.

This could allow new association health plans to grow so big, they qualify as large employers — and Obamacare does not require large employers to offer plans that cover essential health benefits.

WSTA Counsel Sends Letter to City of LA to Stop Truck Signage Requirements

On October 6th, WSTA counsel sent a letter to the City of LA construction management; the letter stated that, "As General Counsel for the Western States Trucking Association (WSTA), it has come to our attention that a provision included within the City of Los Angeles Ordinance No. 184827 (the Hillside Construction Regulation "HCR" Supplemental Use District) violates a federal law. Specifically, the requirement that all hauling vehicles must display a placard identifying the project address contravenes Title 49 of the U.S. Code Section 14506. Attached is a letter further detailing the matter. A hard copy of this letter is also being mailed to you."

"Please advise us at your earliest convenience how you intend to address this defective ordinance, as well as any other city laws, rules, regulations, or conditional permits containing the same or similar placard requirement. Thank you for your prompt attention to this matter."

LEGISLATIVE ISSUES of INTEREST

Governor Brown announced that he signed a number of bills;

WSTA-supported AB 1094 (Choi) will go into effect on January 1, 2018. This is the bill that reduces the base violation fines from \$100 to \$35 for running a red light at a highway on-ramp.

These 11 bills were signed "to strengthen California's zero and near-zero emission vehicle markets and accelerate the state's transition away from fossil-fuel-powered engines," including:

- SB 498 (Skinner) – Requires at least 50 percent of the state's light-duty vehicle fleet to be zero-emission vehicles by 2025, up from the current goal of 25 percent by 2020.
- AB 188 (Salas) – Strengthens California's program to remove the most polluting vehicles from the road by allowing certain light-duty pick-up trucks to qualify as a replacement vehicle so long as the truck meets higher vehicle efficiency standards.
- AB 544 (Bloom) – Extends California's program to allow certain clean alternative fuel vehicles to use high-occupancy vehicle (carpool) lanes.
- AB 615 (Cooper) – Extends the income caps for the Clean Vehicle Rebate Project to continue providing air quality and greenhouse gas emissions reduction benefits through programs that encourage the purchase of zero-emissions vehicles.
- AB 630 (Cooper) – Codifies a clean-car program that benefits low-income residents by helping them replace high-polluting vehicles with cleaner and more efficient vehicles.
- AB 739 (Chau) – Requires at least 15 percent of specified heavy-duty vehicles newly purchased by state agencies to be zero-emission beginning in 2025 and at least 30 percent of those vehicles to be ZEV beginning in 2030.
- AB 1073 (Garcia) – Extends the requirement for funding of early deployment of clean heavy-duty trucks as part of California's Clean Truck, Bus and Off-Road Vehicle program.
- AB 1082 and AB 1083 (Burke) – Authorize pilot programs to allow for new electric vehicle charging stations at state parks and beaches.
- AB 1274 (O'Donnell) – Temporarily expands the smog check exemption to vehicles eight model years old or newer while increasing the smog abatement fee to strengthen air quality programs.

- AB 1317 (Gray) – Adds stationary irrigation or water conveyance engines to the list of equipment eligible for air quality incentives.
- AB 1452 (Muratsuchi) – Authorizes local jurisdictions to dedicate on-street parking spaces on public streets for the exclusive purpose of charging a parked electric vehicle, provided appropriate signage is installed.

ELD presentation

A federal mandate to switch from paper logs to electronic recordkeeping for driver hours-of-service (HOS) compliance begins December 18, 2017. Does this mandate affect your operations? Are there exemptions you can utilize? When will California adopt a mandate that applies for drivers who only operate under California's HOS regulations? Joe's presentation will answer many of your questions.
